

DEPA Research Projects - PoC

South Africa

- PhotoVoice to amplify the voice of participants
- Photographs that represent aspects of participants' lives/experiences
- Communities that are marginalized and in conflict
- Engage young people
- Soundscapes
- Sound artist produced sound stories
- Exploring sounds of conflict and peace

Nigeria

- Community theatre
- Life stories
- Oral histories
- Working closely with communities in IDP camps and the wider community
- Developing long-term relationships that are of value to the communities

Uganda

- PhotoVoice methodology
- In Oruchinga refugee settlement
- Extending into Nakivale
- Building on work of the previous award
- Youth group formed participants become trainers

Zimbabwe

- Intergenerational workshops

Phase 3 projects - Decolonising Education for Peace in Africa Fund

The Decolonising Education for Peace in Africa project will fund projects in the field of peace education.

The DEPA Network is expanding. We are commissioning new projects to enhance and expand on the findings and knowledge from the <u>Proof of Concept projects in Phase 1</u> and Phase 2 Projects.

The projects should be of 3-6 months duration and the following levels of funding will be available:

- Up to 5 Individual Researcher Grants, of up to £5,000. We encourage proposals that meet the <u>value for money criteria</u> of the AHRC. Only UK-based individuals can apply for the Individual Researcher Grants.
- Up to 4 Small Project Grants, will be commissioned, each with a value of £10,000 £30,000. We encourage proposals that
 meet the value for money criteria of the AHRC. The Small Project Grants are open to UK and African scholars, NGOs and
 other organisations which work in the relevant areas.
- Up to 2 Large Project Grants will be commissioned, each with a value of between £30,000 and £60,000. We encourage
 proposals that meet the <u>value for money criteria</u> of the AHRC. The Large Project Grants are open to UK and African scholars,
 NGOs and other organisations which work in the relevant areas.

Please note: costings should be calculated using 100% of UK partners' costs even though, as per UKRI rules, only 80% of these costs can be funded by the grant.

DEPA Funding Call

- 3 levels of funding
- Researcher Grants up to £5k (UK only)
- Small Grants (£10k-£30k)
- Large Grants (£30k-£60k)
- All must end by 31 March 2023
- Duration 3-6 months

- Key dates
- Closing date 29 April 2022
- Panel meeting early May
- Decisions within 2 months
